\*\*\*According to Ballot Measure 1, which passed during the 2025 election cycle, the size of the Senate has been expanded to include representation from more student voices. This includes the expansion of the number of senators designated from the School of Interdisciplinary Arts & Sciences which will split into 5 distinct units in the 2025-2026 academic year. Due to this change, candidates running for SIAS Senator seats may not have accumulated the majority of votes, but still earned a Senate seat. If two candidates were running with the same major, a greater number of votes is needed to secure the seat for that particular SIAS unit.
